Commissioner Chambers

Meeting Called to Order:

Chairman Hurwitz called the meeting to order at 9:00 a.m.

Commissioners Present:

Chairman Ben Hurwitz, Commissioner Rod Brewer and Vice-Chairman Errol Galt were present for the meeting.

ACTION #1

Vice Chairman Galt moved to approve the minutes from September 2nd and September 4th, 2025. Commissioner Brewer seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed.

Chairman Hurwitz moved to approve the minutes from August 19th and August 26th, 2025. Commissioner Brewer seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed.

Sheriff Report-Jon Lopp

County Sheriff Jon Lopp entered the chambers at 9:00 a.m.

Lopp distributed Meagher County Sheriff's Office Complaint Report for the Month of August 2025. In this month, the Sheriff's Office received three hundred six (306) incoming calls, thirty-six (36) 9-1-1 calls, and one hundred sixty-eight (168) people coming into the office. For a total of five hundred ten (510) people who contacted the Sheriff's Office.

Lopp informed the Commissioners that in August, two (2) incidents within the city and two (2) incidents within the county were required to be reported to the National Incident-Based Reporting System (NIBRS).

- (2) Two tickets were issued in the City and four (4) in the County.
- (0) Zero warrants of arrest were served in the City and zero (0) in the County.
- (4) Four sets of civil papers were served in the City and two (2) in the County.

Lopp reported that they received a bid for a new 2025 F-150 4x4 patrol pickup. Lopp also stated there will be a week-long state trial at the end of the month and the deputies will be getting overtime.

Road Report-Jake Kusek

Road Supervisor Jake Kusek entered the chambers at 9:28 a.m.

Kusek reported that he is currently finishing up mowing and grading the road. One of the graders experienced a water pump failure, and another has springs protruding from the bottom of the seat. Kusek is looking into getting these fixed.

Health Nurse Report-Eva Kerr R.N.

County Health Nurse Eva Kerr R.N. entered the chambers at 9:57 a.m.

Kerr reported that on August 15, 2025, she visited the Martinsdale Colony and administered vaccinations to nine children.

Currently, there are five Homemaker clients and two Respite clients receiving services.

Kerr noted the need to purchase RSV vaccine doses totaling \$2,500 for five doses. This purchase is required to participate in the Vaccines for Children program, which provides free vaccines to uninsured children and Medicaid recipients. Although she did not acquire the vaccine last year, it is now a mandatory requirement. She has not yet encountered any kid's cases of RSV this year.

Cemetery Report-Kathy Palmer

Cemetery Board Chair Kathy Palmer and Cemetery Sexton Randy Hardin entered the chambers at 10:57 a.m.

The Commissioners inquired about the status of the new lawn mower. Hardin reported that it has been purchased and is performing well.

Palmer, Hardin, and the Commissioners discussed the finalized budget figures for Fiscal Year 2025–2026. During the conversation, the Commissioners shared their intention to construct a new building at the Cemetery in the future.

Palmer also mentioned that there are currently three indigent individuals who require burial arrangements.

Library Report-Rachel Wahlstrom

Library Co-Director Rachel Wahlstrom entered the chambers 11:27 a.m.

Wahlstrom shared that the seed library has been very successful. Community members have both donated and borrowed seeds. The initial setup cost was \$120. At the end of the year, they will submit a report to the state detailing what was borrowed to help with inventory tracking.

Technology assistance for seniors continues to be in demand. Starting October 1, 2025, Wahlstrom will visit the senior center for one hour on the first Wednesday of each month to provide tech help.

A long-term goal for the library is to establish a bookmobile. In the meantime, they are exploring a smaller-scale outreach program using personal vehicles to deliver materials within city limits. While this initiative is still in development, they are also preparing to launch a program at the hospital's Memory Café for individuals with Alzheimer's and dementia in the coming months. Shannon Washburn and Rachel Wahlstrom will attend the directors' meeting on September 15–16, 2025. They've been invited to assist with Local Government Relations, a state project aimed at strengthening connections between libraries and county government entities. Their role will include helping train new library directors across the state.

The Montana Library Association's fall meeting will be held at Chico Hot Springs on October 5–6, 2025.

Preschool and story time programs have begun, with 26 children currently participating.

Wahlstrom also presented a copy of the library's new logo.

Adopt a Final Budget-Jennifer Deems

Finance Officer Jennifer Deems entered the chambers at 11:09 a.m.

Deems and the Commissioners signed the Appropriation Authority and a Resolution Establishing the Method of Levying Voted Mills.

ACTION #2

Vice Chairman Galt moved to approve a Resolution Fiscal Year 25.26 #29 Establishing the Method of Levying Voted Mills as a Dollar Amount. Commissioner Brewer seconded the motion. A vote was taken and passed. The issue is hereby resolved.

RESOLUTION NO. FY 25.26 #29

RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING THE METHOD OF LEVYING VOTED MILLS AS REQUIRED BY LAWS 2025, CHAPTERS 674 AND 767 PASSED IN THE 69TH MONTANA LEGISLATIVE SESSION

WHEREAS, Laws 2025, Chapters 674 and 767 passed in the 69th Montana Legislative Session requires that a taxing entity with a local mill levy limit of a specific number of mills that may be imposed that was authorized by the voters before May 13, 2025, shall elect one of two methods to recalculate those mill levies.

WHEREAS, a taxing entity may either elect to:

- (a) transition a voted mill levy to a dollar-based mill levy equal to the amount of property taxes assessed in fiscal year 2025 and thereafter subject to the provisions of 15-10-420(1)(a); or
- (b) levy the number of mills in fiscal year 2026 that will generate the amount of property taxes assessed in fiscal year 2025. In fiscal years after 2026, the local government may levy an amount not to exceed the number of mills levied in fiscal year 2026.

WHEREAS, the County of Meagher has the following mill levy authorized by the voters before May 13, 2025:



Meagher County City Library's County Mill Levy – 5 voted mills
Meagher County Weed mill levy – 3 voted mills
Meagher County Extension – 3 voted mills

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Commissioners Meagher County, Montana, that:


- 1) The Meagher County City Library's County voted mill levy, Meagher County Weed voted mill levy, Meagher County Extension voted mill levy will be transitioned to a dollar-based mill levy equal to the total authorized ad valorem tax revenue assessment in fiscal year 2025 and thereafter subject to the provisions of 15-10-420(1)(a); and
- 2) The total authorized ad valorem tax revenue assessed in fiscal year 2025 for the Meagher County City Library's County voted mill levy was \$45,910.00; and Meagher County Weed mill levy was \$42,237; and the Meagher County Extension voted mill levy was \$27,546.
- 3) Hereafter, the Meagher County Commissioners may levy up to \$45,910.00 plus the rate of inflation provided for in Section 15-10-420(1)(a) MCA for the Meagher County City Library; and \$42,237 plus the rate of inflation provided for in Section 15-10-420(1)(a) MCA for the Meagher County Weed; and \$27,546 plus the rate of inflation provided for in Section 15-10-420(1)(a) MCA for the Meagher County Extension; and
- 4) For fiscal year 2026, the Meagher County Commissioners will Levy \$45910 for the Meagher County / City Library's County voted mill levy; and \$42,237 for the Meagher County Weed mill levy; and \$27,546 for the Meagher County Extension mill levy.

**RESOLUTION NO. FY25.26 #
A RESOLUTION ADOPTING FINAL BUDGET AND APPROPRIATION AUTHORITY
FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JULY 1, 2025 AND ENDING JUNE 30, 2026**

WHEREAS, Section 7-6-4030, MCA, provides that the governing body shall adopt the final budget by resolution. The resolution must:

Authorize appropriations to defray the expenses or liabilities for the fiscal year and Establish legal spending limits at the level of detail in the resolution.

WHEREAS, Section 7-6-4020 requires that a preliminary annual operating budget must be prepared for the local government; and

WHEREAS, Section 7-6-4021 requires that the governing body shall cause a notice of public hearing on the preliminary or amended budget to be published, and

WHEREAS, Section 7-6-4024, provides that the governing body must hold a public hearing in accordance with the notice given pursuant to 7-6-4021; and

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners held a public hearing on September 4th, 2025 where residents of the County were allowed to express their concerns about the proposed budget; and

WHEREAS, The Board of County Commissioners has reviewed the proposed budget, received the estimated ending cash balances for all county funds, made changes to the budget as deemed necessary following the public hearing(s) and from input by elected officials and department heads, and computed the estimated taxes, fees and assessments needed to fund the fiscal year 2025 - 2026 budget.


NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of Meagher County that: The final budget after any amendments to the preliminary budget and after considering any public comment is adopted. This resolution authorizes:


Appropriations to defray the expenses or liabilities for the fiscal year and sets the legal spending limits at the county fund level as set out in FY 25.26 Attachment "A". (The fund level detail is stated in the formal budget document and established in the County's accounting system), sets levies as set out in FY 25.26 Attachment "B" and sets salaries/wages as set out in FY 25.26 attachment "C".

The effective date of this resolution is July 1, 2025, even if the resolution is adopted after that date.


